- Is NZ website useful? Yes, but it is hard to navigate. There have been changes to the online entry into tournaments.
- Congress you can now pay online with credit card
- Does the NZCBA get to all members? No
- Are teaching resources worthwhile? Yes
- Do we have sufficient directors? No
- Are you able to attract new players? Yes, but it is difficult keeping them
- Do you want more sessions or to change start and finish times? No
- Master points are of interest to some and not others
- Do members play in tournaments? Yes
- Do we struggle to get assistance? No
- What worries do we have? Aging members and people reluctant to take on positions on committee

NZCBA are working on the grading system and may replace the rating system and bring in handicapping. They may also use british handicapping system which dictates who people are able to play with. The committee recommended leaving master points as they are.

Congress this year is being held in Tauranga in a bigger venue than Hamilton. NZ bridge is to hold an International meeting. They are also looking at increasing staff administration to support the clubs marketing.

Finance:

Neil moved that the accounts that have been paid totalling \$6385.07 be confirmed and the accounts to be paid totalling \$1827.97 be approved, seconded Olive; Approved

General Business:

Jane reported for the Rejuvenation Committee.

It is thought by some that the charge for lessons is too high but majority feel it is a good price. One member suggested we halve Wednesday table money to encourage players but there was a consensus not to do so.

When lessons finish we may encourage learners to come to sessions by giving them a few free tickets but that decision will be made at the end of lessons.

We need to be thinking about how to get existing members to support Monday nights We need people, or a full room, more than the money.

When beginners pay and are ready to play in sessions, they are put in the computer and given a number, i.e. at their Graduation.

Our marketing for lessons can be considered successful. We needed 31 to join to cover our costs and we had 46 on seats the first week. The aim was to encourage people in the age group 50 to 64 and we did achieve that. Some still feel the cost is an issue.

The beginners cited the following as their reason for attending: Existing members 15, Library 10, Road signs 12

We would like to thank Kim, Kevin and Yvonne for the great effort that they put into driving this marketing. A big thanks also to Lyn for her organising the Library team and the tiresome task of following up on all those interested parties.

Fund Raising.

We were turned down by the Whangarei Council for funds for the roof repairs. We need \$8500 for this project. Kim moved that Jane apply to the Oxford Trust for funds i.e. \$8500, to cover the repairs to the roof, seconded Janice; Approved

Helen moved that Jane apply to the Pub Charity for funds to purchase charging stations, the cost being \$400, seconded Janice; Approved

Honour Boards .The engravers are no longer able to get gold leaf for the Boards. The product they are currently using is not satisfactory for our needs. It was suggested we look at vinyl signs where they layer the names on or try sign writers. If you have suggestions please speak to Margaret Hooson. She is responsible for engraving cups and boards.

Library.

There are no beginner's books available at the club. Jane and Richard have ordered "Some Principles of Card Playing" by Paul Masters from Richard Solomon on a sale or return basis. Jane was given permission to purchase a second hand Encyclopaedia of Bridge for the club.

It was suggested we have a film night, with pizzas, to watch the film "Dirty Tricks" at the club. It is available from 21st June to 11th July and we would stream it to club.

Banking signatories are now sorted.

Broome tournament. We had 17 tables, \$300 in sponsorship and the raffle made \$200 The profit was \$983 with catering costing \$300 and \$2.30 per head for the C points.
