# PLAYING AT THE CLUB AT COVID ALERT LEVEL 2

- Stay home if you are sick.
- QR scan-in or sign-in to record every attendance is mandatory.
- Mask wearing is highly recommended at Level 2 but is no longer compulsory.
- No visitors to play from outside our club membership.
- The club encourages all of our members to have their two vaccination shots before returning to club play.

## Why do we ask for your cooperation in this way?

Many of our members are older and with vulnerable health conditions. We need to act together to protect them and our wider Whangarei community. The Delta virus is far more virulent. If a member tests positive the message to others needs to go out immediately to go home and isolate. If you scan in using your smart phone this can be done in seconds by contact tracers. If you have to locate who played at the club, give names and numbers manually, they all need a phone call from a tracer – it can take many hours. During those hours they are potentially out and about spreading Covid.

# Please make scanning in on entry to the club a part of your routine of coming to play.

At the Gold Coast congress for 2022 every player must produce proof of being fully vaccinated with two shots and two weeks having expired after the second shot, for their entry to play to be accepted or produce a medical certificate exempting them from having the vaccination.

We are hoping for eight teams for our Monday night teams event starting 4 October. Sure to be a lot of fun, teams of four will compete in 2 x 8 board matches starting at 7pm. Matters highlighted from the survey:
