# **Covid protocols**

For now, the decision taken last year to make the club a vaccinated venue from 3 December 2021 remains unchanged. The committee agreed to have the status of the club as a standing item on their agenda each month for review.

- 3. Members no longer need to scan in using the QR codes.

# **Club Projects**

Our club survey gave the committee some priorities from the membership view point. Thank you to all who took the time to complete the survey and give your feedback. Here are the main outcomes from a review of the feedback given:

- The club will work towards installation of a disabled toilet.
- The newsletter will continue in its current format as popular with members.
- The club facebook page is not well used by club members and so less commitment in time will be given to updating this – unless a social media savvy member would like to put their name forward to look after this.
- The existing stock of mugs have been thoroughly cleaned many thanks to Judy Allison for undertaking this task as well as a deep clean of the kitchen.
- The comments regarding refreshment standards have been noted. Efforts are being made to keep the coffee granulated and a variety of tea available.
- Future capital projects where grants may be applied for to include:
  - Magnetic name tags
  - Microphone system
  - Dishwasher to replace steriliser
  - Outdoor furniture and outdoor seating area created
  - Refurbishment of the men's toilet area
- More opportunity for directors to develop by sharing director duties at playing sessions and being coached/mentored by existing directors and a practical hands-on directors session with Allan Joseph to be investigated.

Some guidance to our members on two matters raised within the survey:

- For graded competitions do check in the programme book for the graded opportunities that arise. Several events during the year have an open/int/jun trophy attached to them. On Tuesday evenings there are opportunities for more junior players to play with an Open player.

## St John health shuttle for members and looking for volunteer drivers

Whangarei St John recently took over the health shuttle service for Whangarei and surrounds from Red Cross. St John kindly donated an AED to the club in 2021. This supportive association continues, and they wanted to let all of the bridge club members know of the availability of this service. It is a koha service available weekdays and must be booked at least 24 hours in advance. The shuttle is wheelchair capable with automated lift and also has an automated step and grab rails if not using the wheelchair lift to onboard. If you have difficulty reaching your appointments – call 0800 WAKA ORA to book.

St John also need volunteer drivers to take people to their healthcare appointments and to support the community. If you have some time to offer to St John to become one of their drivers contact Jane Stearns who can give you more details. Discussions are also underway for the provision of the shuttle to help our club members with transport to tournaments at weekends, especially those with disabilities or wheelchair users.
